What is Central Intake?

Central Intake represents a single point of access for referrals to multiple health services, helping primary care providers ensure patients receive timely, appropriate care, no matter the referral type. Central Intake is designed to reduce administrative burden, improve communication, and optimize patient access across the region.



Why Use Central Intake?

Reduces Duplication:
24% fewer duplicate referrals, saving time for providers and patients ¹

Improves Appropriateness:
Enhances referral pathways to connect patients with the appropriate care ²

Reduces Wait Times:
Up to 57% reduction for surgical referrals ⁴
20–25% lower wait times for non-emergency assessments ²

Streamlines Communication: Improves coordination between referring providers and specialists, while enabling senders to monitor referral status ^{2,3}.
